## Three Eagle Boating Etiquette:

Most Skippers have etiquette standards and rules for their vessels. Actions while onboard determines how often guests are invited back.

## General rules and etiquette while aboard Three Eagle.

- 1. The Skipper is the Boss and is ALWAYS right.... (even when he's wrong).
- 2. Do not countermand instructions from the Skipper. (see rule #1).
- 3. Do not "help out" or do things on your own without first clearing it with the Skipper.
- 4. Pay attention to the pre-departure and safety instructions prior to getting underway.
- 5. Everything has it's place. Return it to where you found it, and like you found it.
- 6. No running or horseplay while aboard.
- 7. Alcohol is permitted, but not intoxication. The Skipper will return to port immediately.
- 8. Safety is of prime concern. Report to the Skipper any un-safe conditions you observe.
- 9. Underway all beverages are either in hand or in a cup holder. None allowed on bridge.
- 10. Report ANY spills immediately to the Skipper so it can be cleaned up immediately.
- 11. No fishing poles on the deck. Pole is either in your hand or in a pole holder.
- 12. No fish on the deck. Fish are either in the net (off the swim step) or in the fish box.
- The Skipper nets fish unless assigned otherwise. Safety reasons.
- 14. No fish cleaning anywhere on the deck. No fish slime tracked onto the Salon carpet.
- Lost or damaged gear or equipment is expected to be replaced.
- 16. No smoking on board. Anytime. Ever. Period.
- 17. If you wear extra tuffs, (or lugged boots) remove the rocks/dirt from the treads.
- 18. In foggy weather do not disturb the Skipper. Assist as "lookout" when asked.
- 19. In rough weather, remain seated when instructed by the Skipper.
- 20. Do not sit, stand or block the Helm station unless asked to do so by the Skipper.
- 21. The Flybridge is off limits to kids under age 13 wearing a life-jacket.
- 22. Follow the toilet operation instruction to the letter. Otherwise it's "Honey Bucket" time.
- During emergencies follow the Skippers instructions immediately.
- Underway no one is allowed out on the swim step, side decks or front deck.
- 25. Boats are expensive to operate and maintain. Donations are welcome.
